What is an apprenticeship?

An apprenticeship is a combination of work and study by mixing on the job training with additional learning. Apprentices are employed to do a job whilst studying for a formal qualification. By the end of an apprenticeship programme apprentices will hopefully have gained the skills, knowledge and behaviours needed to succeed in their chosen career or progress onto the next apprenticeship level.

Can I use my levy to pay for just behavioural apprenticeship development?

Yes, you can use the levy fund from your account to pay for all aspects of knowledge, skills and behaviour training development needed to complete an apprenticeship programme.
